Defect

A small wiring loom may overheat and char when the product is running on 12V DC.

Hazards

In the unlikely event that overheating/charring occurs, and there is also foreign combustible material in the vicinity behind the refrigerator, it could lead to a fire.

What to do

If you have one of the above refrigerator models in your RV or caravan, check the serial number on the rating label located inside to the left. If your S/No falls within one of the ranges above, **stop using the product on settings AUTO or** immediately, and contact Dometic to arrange for fitment of a replacement wiring loom free of charge.

NOTE: it is perfectly safe to continue using the product (when parked) on either gas or AC. Select either ◊ (gas) or ⋄ (AC) with the control knob.

Caravan Fire Safety Part 1

CARAVAN FIRE EXTINGUISHER

Today I am going to talk about a 1KG ABC Dry Powder Fire Extinguisher that we are required to have in our caravan. As a matter of interest they are available for around \$19 at Bunnings or \$29 for an Extinguisher and a Fire Blanket.

This dry powder extinguisher will put the fire out quite rapidly by the discharge of 1KG of finely ground dry powder at 1000 KPA. It will interrupt the chain reaction of flame and snuff the fire out. It will not cool the fire and there is a possibility of a reignition if it is a fat fire.

The extinguisher is usually located near your exit door of the caravan. Each person that travels in the van should unfasten and remove the extinguisher a few times just to get used to the action, you need to become familiar.

Because the extinguisher sits in the same position the powder will tend to compact over time. The vibrations on the road are a significant cause of

compaction so if you do lots of kilometres give it a regular shake. At least once a year or before a trip remove the extinguisher and turn it upside down and shake it vigorously. I have seen these extinguishers fail because of compaction.

Check the pressure gauge, it should always be in the green zone. If you should press the trigger and break the seal the gas pressure will leak out in 48 hours. The extinguishing powder is basically finely ground bicarbonate soda and the extinguisher will discharge within 20 - 25 seconds.

The only problem using this extinguisher in your van is the high pressure will fill your van with 1KG of powder that will take considerable time to remove in the cleanup. I prefer to use a Fire Blanket.



FIRE BLANKETS



Fire Blankets come in two sizes a 1M x 1M square size and a1M x 1.8M size. Fire blankets cost around \$10-\$15 and I recommend these for our use as they are so simple and effective to use. They can be used on all types of small fires especially the kitchen hot oil type fire. It is just a simple matter of gently laying the blanket over the fire area.

Once you cover the fire area it is then essential that you turn off the heat source and then wait for the burning substance to cool down.

A Fire Blanket can only be used once then you should dispose of it and purchase a new one.

Should you experience a person receiving burns from fire then the person should be wrapped in the blanket to smother the fire and then laid on the ground. Once used throw the blanket away.

Another bonus is that the blanket could be used as a shield to escape from a burning room or van.

I recommend that members buy the larger blanket and locate them near your doorway, front boot or in your car.

Fruit Cake (very good, keeps well)

500g Mixed Dried Fruit

- 1 cup Brandy or Sherry (used Sherry)
- 1 cup Water
- 125g Butter
- 2 tbsp Maple syrup
- 1 cup Brown Sugar
- 1 tsp Bicarb
- 1 tbsp Boiling Water
- 2 Eggs
- 1 cup SR Flour
- 1 cup Plain Flour

Optional ½ tsp mixed spice, ¼ tsp nutmeg

1 tsp Vanilla Essence

- 1. Soak fruit overnight in alcohol.
- 2. Place soaked fruit, water, butter, maple syrup and sugar in a saucepan. Slowly bring to the boil then remove from heat and add bicarb mixed with one tablespoon boiling water.

Cool for 15 mins.

Add lightly beaten eggs, mixing thoroughly. Fold in sifted flours & spices and vanilla.

3. Preheat oven to 160°C. Spoon batter into the prepared tin, smooth the surface.

Bake for up to 75 - 90 minutes. Or until the cake springs back when gently pressed in the middle. (hint should reach 99° C).

Allow cake to cool in the tin for an hour then invert onto a cooling rack to remove. Allow to cool completely.






