Planned talk on Electric Blankets: The planned talk on electric bed blankets and fire safety was postponed until the July meeting. This was due to the meeting going a little too long and we would have needed to cut the safety talk short

Speaking at Meetings: Members have raised the problem of hearing all discussions at meetings. They have requested that we increase the volume of the loud speaker system and also members speaking volume at meetings. It

is very hard to judge the volume of sound from our position in front but Des said he will make arrangement to ensure all members hear all discussions in future.

Narrabeen Booking: Just a reminder that the normal charges for Narrabeen are \$39 per night less 10% if you are a Big 4 member. We as TLC members receive a large discount and only pay approx. \$26 or \$27 a night (2009 charges will be confirmed shortly) The Committee of Management also charges each person \$15 for the week and that provides for the cost of the large Marquee, lights, hired B-B_Q and gas, tea/coffee and milk for 7 days, also a dinner on one evening. So to book a site just pay your \$15 deposit to the Treasurer and the Tour Director will confirm your site.

Hayman Reese CD Loan: The playing of the CD from Hayman Reese prior to the meeting starting was not a success due to sound/hearing. But at least it started people thinking about the subject and we think it is a CD that all members should

look at in their home. Our club has five (5) copies of the CD available for loan and Philip McDonald has agreed to co-ordinate the lending to members. Please ring Philip on 4328 3435 to book a CD

Fire Extinguishers: The subject of fire extinguishers was raised at the June meeting by a member who had spoken to Fire Brigade officers at a caravan show. The Firefighter stressed the need to turnover or shake the extinguisher monthly to keep the contents free. Members should inspect their fire extinguisher on a regular basis; check that the pressure needle is located in the green position. Then vigorously shake the extinguisher to help keep the contents (powder substance) free and loose. The main problem with powder type extinguishers is that the constant vibration of travelling causes the powder to compact. Then they may not operate correctly when required.

Fire Blankets: The need to have a fire blanket in your home and caravan was raised and discussed briefly at the June meeting. We will have a demonstration of the correct use of a fire blanket at the July meeting. Des suggests this is an excellent method of dealing with most small (safe) fires. We have fire blankets in our kitchen and garage also one in our caravan. We have **no** fire extinguisher in our house

Lubrication- Tow Equipment: Lots of discussion on the need to lubricate fittings in relation to tow gear. The suggestions put forward included the need to use ordinary grease, water resistant grease, bee's wax, WD40 and a number of other lubricants. The most important point is that it is necessary to use a lubricant. If you have doubt check with your caravan service person or your van supplier and use it each time you hook up.

New Inspection Arrangements: From 1 July 2008 the period for vehicle safety inspection exemption for new light vehicles is extended from three to five years. Most light vehicles, including passenger vehicles, commercial vehicles, motor cycles, panel vans, **caravans**, trailers and heavier four-wheel drive vehicles, with a compliance date of July 2003 onwards can be renewed without an inspection report for the first five years. Your renewal notice will indicate if an inspection is required.

Stamp Duty: We understand that from the 1st July 2009 the NSW Government has removed the Stamp Duty payment from new Caravans. This will bring us in line with other States and should be a reduction of around \$1000. This will save a lot of us the trip to Victoria

Transport Changes for Seniors: From the 1st January 2009 people holding a Seniors Card have been entitled to concession fares in all states. This matter had been under discussion for about 10 years. The Federal Government has offered almost \$50 million to assist the states and territories in providing this concession. We actually experienced this great scheme last month in Adelaide and in Darwin. In Adelaide we paid less than \$2 to travel all over Adelaide for the day on tram/bus we were very surprised and pleased. In Adelaide we caught a bus from the Airport to the City for a \$1.20 each and cab fare was somewhere between \$15 to \$40. In Darwin we paid \$1.20 each for a bus ticket for the day. Further to this, Senior's Card holders can receive 25% off standard adult fares on any of Great Southern Rail's services.

LPG V Petrol: LPG is cheaper than petrol due partly to Federal excise applied to ULP of 38.143 cents per litre which currently is

not applied to LPG. Average metropolitan fuel prices at Feb '09 were ULP \$1.22/litre, LPG 59.6 cents/litre. LPG price is usually around half that of petrol, although the prices move independently of each other. As LPG has a lower energy content rating than petrol, fuel consumption can increase by up to 30%. For a family 6-cylinder sedan the increase in LPG consumption over petrol should be around 20%, i.e. more stops to fill up. Consider a trip in a *Fal-den* of 5 000 kms using petrol at, say 14 litres/100 kms. Petrol used is $5000 \times 14/100 = 700$ litres, @ \$1.22/litre, total cost = \$854.00 Consider the same trip using LPG at $(14/100 \times 120\%) = 16.8$ litres/100kms, LPG used is $5000/16.8/100 = 840$ litres, @ 59.6 c/litre, total cost = \$500.64. These figures are only estimates as both the cost of fuel and actual consumption will fluctuate. In considering these costs, no allowance has been made for the cost of converting to LPG. **Note** that LPG will attract excise of 2.5 cents per litre from July 2011 progressing to 12.5 cents/litre by July 2015. UHF Radios: Whilst travelling to destinations with other vans its great to be able to talk by UHF radio. Also when you are on a trip and the members decide to go somewhere in a car pool it's really helpful for all members to hear what is happening. To purchase a set for your vehicle can be expensive so before you do you should check out the idea of purchasing hand held types. They are not very expensive and operate OK. Just ask around among club members there are a number already in the club who have handhelds.

Power Lead 15Amp to 10Amp. We understand that a number of members carry a short lead i.e. about one meter long

that has a 15Amp female plug with a 10 Amp male plug on the other end. This allows you to plug into any ordinary 10Amp outlet. We understand a few people used these to obtain power at the Meet & Greet at Cessnock. We have been advised these are illegal and it may affect your Insurance should an incident occur.

15Amp Power Lead Alterations: We have heard that on occasions members have had to file the large Earth pin on the 15amp lead down to fit into a power outlet. Again this would possibly be illegal. So be aware
