Breaksafe Battery Monitor: At the State Assoc. meeting a member presented a paper on breaksafe battery monitors in a towing vehicle where the trailer weight exceeds 2 tonnes. He included the RTA vehicle Standards Information Sheet (No 22) and the Vehicle Inspectors Bulletin No 6 which clearly requires a monitor in the towing vehicle. Cases have been reported where registration had been refused because of a lack of monitor and one member has been fined over \$600 for not having the monitor. The monitors cost less than \$100 and can be easily installed a member had obtained quotes from three auto electricians ranging from \$375/\$400 to \$550.
