Steele's Around Aussie Report (cont)

10/08/09 We decided to go on a Surface Tour of Mount Isa Mine it was a 2 hour bus tour which takes in Black Star open cut and the surface operations of the mine and showed us how they sort the copper, zinc, led and silver we were amazed of how big the operation is, it was very interesting. Mount Isa is the 5th largest city in the world by surface area; Mount Isa is 43,010 square klms in size with 22,000 populations, we also went to an underground Hospital and Museum, it was built in 1942 following the bombing of Darwin. We also went to the lookout at dust where you can see 360degrees of the city and the mine looks like a fairy land, we also went for a drive to Lake Moondarra where it is stocked with Barramundi and you don't need a permit to fish.

14/08/09. Arrived at Karumba It is a small fishing town that survives on tourism: there are only around 600 permanent populations. Key and I went on a fishing charter, there were 7 on board it was a good morning, and I mostly caught sharks and catfish and 1 salmon but Kev cleaned up and caught 5 salmon so he was very happy. That afternoon the annual school fete was on from 2pm till 12pm and is held at the Golf Club, the whole town supports it, the Restaurants and the 2 Hotels close their doors at 6pm to go to the fete and there are only 63 children in the school and last year they raised over \$30,000. On Sunday we went on a Sunset Cruise they told us all about the history of the town and all about the big flood they had last vear when the town was cut off for 10 weeks. They served a beautiful supper of prawns, fruit and nibbles with a choice of drinks to have while we watched the sunset.

17/08/09. Today we are heading towards Cairns we stopped at George Town for the night.

18/08/09.We were told to stop at Ravenshoe old Railway station as it only cost a donation of \$6.00 for a powered site and it was set up like a train museum. We went for a drive to Mt Hypipamee, which is a crater and also went to Millstream Falls,

19/08/09.We are at Cairns for 3 days. We are going to take it easy, We are heading down to Mission Beach to catch up with Lee and Col Chambers.

While we were there we caught up with Tom and Bernice Fuller who are members of our Caravan Club. That night we

went out for tea to The Grand View Hotel where they shot parts of the movie The Australian and the Hotel was full of pictures of the movie all around the walls. The next night we had a BBQ with them before we headed off.

03/09/09 Today we are heading to Airlie Beach and will catch up with Lee and Col we have booked into Island Gateway Holiday Park Airlie has changed so much since we were there 20 years ago. It has become built out with large Resorts and Backpackers accommodation. The weather has been great around 28 degrees: the 4 of us have booked into going on a cruise for father's day to Hamilton, Daydream and Whitehaven Beach. We had a wonderful day and the water at Whitehaven was 23degrees. we had 3 hours there and did not want to get out of the water. We went for a drive to the Northern Beaches and could not believe how far the tides went out they are not as pretty as our beaches but different. We were recommended to go to The Eimeo Pacific Hotel where it has a 180 degree view of the coast it was worth the drive it was amazing. The next day we drove to the Eungella National Park which is located in

Pioneer Valley 55kms west of Mackay where they had plenty of good walking tracks and if you were lucky you might get to see the Platypus, it was very pictures and also they were harvesting the sugarcane as we drove by. On our way home we were told to stop at The Pinnacle Pub, because according to the locals they have the best Pies in Australia but we think we tasted better down the Murray.

16/09/09. Heading towards Rockhampton but ended up at Emu Beach after a nice drive along the Capricorn Coast it was a quiet park right on the beach so we stayed there overnight.

17/09/09.On our way south we came across a sign to Lake Monduran so that is where we headed. It was a very well kept Park on the side of a Dam and the Fisherman were catching heaps of Barra, we would put it in our note pad for future reference.

18/09/09. Today we have decided to go to Noosa and booked into Tewantin Caravan Park, we couldn't get over how the area has grown the last time we were there they had no beaches but since then they have brought in tons of sand to improve the beaches. While we were there we caught up with Lee and Col again they were staying about an hour away so we ended up going on a trip up the River where you can hop on and off the boat all day. The next day we caught the Punt across to Coolooa National Park and did a little exploring over there, it is very much like Fraser Island where you can camp on the beach and go 4 wheel driving.
