Steeles Around Aussie Report continued From Geraldton.

10/06/09.Kalbarri is a small seaside town we were hoping to do a little fishing. We visited a Sea Horse farm where they are breeding them to survive and thrive as pets they were all different colors it was very interesting.

12/06/09.Denham is a small fishing village there is a great Ocean Park where they take you on a tour of all different types of fish from sharks to sea snakes and it was very informative.

13/06/09.Monkey Mia is 20min drive from Denham a lot has changed since they first started feeding the Dolphins they only feed them 3 times a day and 1 fish per feed it is very controlled because they found the mothers stopped teaching their babies how to catch fish and the babies were dying. There are only 15 Dolphins come in now including their babies and only 8 came in today they all have names but you must not touch them, but it still was a wonderful experience.

15/06/09.On road to Carnarvon we decided to bush camp at Bush Bay which is 10klm on a dirt road off the hwy we were hoping there would be another van there to our amazement there were at least 25 vans there Kevin said he now knows what the baby boomers do in the winter and that is find a quite spot beside the ocean with plenty of fishing, campfires and happy hour and its all free.

16/06/09. Next stop was Coral Bay but on the way we came across a car that had hit a cow and had completely wiped out the whole front of the car. **17/06/09.**We arrived at Coral bay early and when we saw how beautiful it was we decided to book in to a Caravan Park and stay the night. Coral beach water was flat and crystal clear and it was a Marine park so no fishing allowed in a certain area but you could snorkel or swim. We went snorkeling it was amazing to see all the colored fish small and large they also have fish feeding at 3.30pm every day.

18/06/09. Next stop was Exmouth we booked into the Light House Caravan Park.. The Ningaloo Reef runs right along the coastline so the beaches are very protected and crystal clear so it was just right for a swim.

20/06/09 Then off to Tom Price which is a mining town controlled by BHP and Reo Tinto and they own the mines around the town which is hundreds of kilometers from anywhere.

21/06/09. Our next stop was Karajini National Park, and we stayed at Dales camping Ground. On the first day we did the short walk of 2 hours return to Fortescue Falls and Fern Pool, there the Gorge had the most beautiful water fall that went into a crystal pool it was breathtaking. The next day we walked the whole length of the Gorge from Circular Pools to Fern Pools it was classed as a Grade 4 fitness so we were quite pleased with ourselves and it took 4 hours the rock formation and scenery were just amazing. On the way back to the camp a Dingo started following us we don't know who was more scared. The temperature was about 25degrees in the day and dropped to 3 degrees at night.

23/06/09.As we headed up the coast we saw a sign to Pardoo Station little did we know it was a Cattle Station with a Caravan Park in it. The Station was on half a million acres and it had 7 thousand cattle on it and it was situated near the Ocean and was known as a fisherman's paradise, people come up and stay up to 3 months at a time Every night there is a large campfire where every one goes for happy hour and then home for tea and then goes back again

24/06/09. Today we are heading to Eighty Mile Beach it is well known for its fishing and shell collecting we saw heaps of Salmon caught around 18 to 20 lb and heaps of small sharks. Kev decided to go fishing and nothing was caught from then on which is normal. It was a beautiful spot to stay and walk on the Beaches, the tide was over 2 meters everyday.

29/06/09. Today we are going to stop at Barn Hill it was another cattle station and was very rugged place but very friendly. It had a 2 lane bowling green where they played social bowls

01/07/09.We are now on our way to Broome for 2 weeks we were lucky to get into Cable Beach there are over 500 sites but people come back year after year and it is hard to get in. On our way we came across a man with 2 camels pulling a cut down car and a bluey dog walking along the hwy Kev stopped to take a photo and asked him where he was heading too, and his reply was ' I am travelling around the Island..

Cable Park is very nice with a lot of shade, but it is the most expensive park we have stayed at it was \$42.00 a night and a min of 2 weeks The beach is beautiful the water temp is 23deg and the daily temp is 32 deg. The first day we went swimming we were told that only 2 days before a saltwater crocodile was seen at the beach. It is common practice to drive down onto the beach and have your glass of wine and nibbles and watch the sun set while the camels go past. Oh yes we did the sunset camel ride. We also went to a Pearling farm they took us on a boat to show us how they were farmed in the water and we were lucky enough to see a 3 meter crocodile on the shore. On Friday night every one goes to the RSL it consist of a roof and no walls and no poker machines and Kev was very relieved at that, but it had a real Bali feel to it, our meal consist of a \$10.00 meat packet with salad which you cooked yourself The 2 weeks have gone so quick but unfortunately it was time to say good bye to all the people we had met, but we still have got a long way to go.

15/07/09. Derby is famous for their high tide, which rises to 11 meters and the famous Boab trees. The next day we headed out along the Gibbs River road to Windjana Gorge it was a very rough corrugated road but worth it, the gorge was unbelievable. Tunnel Creek we were told it was a must see, on arriving we found we had left our torch behind it is a cave of 750 meters long through the mountain with a stream running through so we asked a couple could we tag along with them. There were small fish and a small fresh water crocodile so as we walked through the water I was a bit nervous but it was beautiful experience it reminded us of the Jenolan Caves.

18/07/09.We then headed to Fitzroy Crossing and booked into Riverside Park, that afternoon we went on a boat trip along Geikie Gorge where they showed us the heights of where the water has been and how it has changed the colors of the rock face, and there were plenty of crocs the guide said at least over 600, it was a pleasant afternoon.

19/07/09.Today we are heading to Mary Pools, only 100klm. Sad to say the river was dry but there were a lot of vans parked but we found a nice shady spot. Kev spoke to our neighbors 'what a surprise' we found out he was 89 and

travelling with his wife around Australia and still playing competitive tennis it was amazing to see such a fit 89 year old.

20/07/09. Today we are passing through Halls Creek and heading to Turkey Creek to see about getting a flight over the Bungle Bungles. The flight was spectacular it was as beautiful as a postcard; it had the most unusual rock formation with all the different colors. We headed towards Kununurra but because it was getting late in the afternoon we stayed at a free camp just short of town

21/07/09 .We booked in for 5 nights it is right on Kununurra Lake. The temp has been around 35 and 36 deg but no humidity so very comfortable. We bumped into Gail and Len Field from the caravan club they were on a 13-day tour through the Kimberley's .We then decided to go on the sunset cruise. The guide told us all about the history of the dam and showed us a lovely spot at sunset where we went swimming with a foam noodle and were handed a glass of champagne it was an unusual experience but an absolute delight.

25/07/09. The weather has been warm around 30 degrees; we took a drive out to El Questro off the Gibbs River road where we had our first puncher. We also visited Emma Gorge the movie Australian had a lot of scenes taken out there. We also went to Wyndham it was the main town and port before Kununurra was built, but now they still use the port for exporting live cattle and grain but most of the industry has been moved to Kununurra. They do have a magnificent look out called Five Rivers Lookout

.01/08/09 We are off to Katherine. We stopped at a bush camp just past Victoria River. We stayed at the big 4 park they had a bistro and every night they had happy hour with a Bush Poet who was excellent and twice a week they had an out side movie where we saw the Australian movie.. We also went on a lunch cruise of 2 gorges at Nitmiluk which was very pleasant, as well as visiting The School of the Air where they broadcast to children over 800,000 sq klm of the Northern Territory., Katherine is a large town and is a main distributor town of the region, we also visited the Hot Springs which is located 5 mins from town we really did enjoy the 32degrees temp of the water.

07/08/09 Today we are heading south, not as scenic as we have been use to. Stopped for morning tea at Mataranka where the story of the Never Never was written, and now we are off to Daly Waters to see the famous Hotel where the cattle drovers stopped on their way to Darwin. In the Hotel there are Ladies underwear and all sorts of odd bits and pieces hanging from the rafters, which include currency, thongs, tee-shirts men's undies you name it and its there. That night we stopped and had a bush camp near Newcastle Waters were we had a fire and watched the moon come up over the plains with other travelers and all agreed what a wonderful life we are having.

08/08/09 Still heading South we stopped at Tennant Creek and then down Barkley Homestead which is a Petrol Station, Caravan Park, Motel and as well has a Bar and Restaurant it is a very large place in the middle of nowhere. We decided to go and have their \$12.00 Roast for dinner and to our amazement we saw a 4 seater plane being pushed up to the Bowser by 1 man and he filled it with fuel, these are the things you would never see at home.

09/08/09 In the morning Kev started talking to an 80 year old man travelling with his wife from Perth, who was driving a 1981 Ford Falcon Panel Van, he had travelled across country through Kalgoorlie to Alice Springs on 700klm of dirt road with no problems at al. He was so proud because they did it when they were 70 and now they are 80. People said they were mad as the car had done over 400,000 kl and they also slept on the ground under the stars, but he did buy her a stretcher because her arthritis was playing up [what a man]. He said, [who said you needed a 4 wheel drive]. At Mount Isa we booked into the Big 4 (Con next month) XXXX Lynda & Kevin
