#### **NSW State Council Report**

There are 141 vans booked into the state rally at Richmond. Next years rally which is being held in Griffith has been relocated to the showground and the maximum has been increased.

The chairman announced that tow rules governing incorporated associations has recently been changed. Also, meetings can now be held with teleconferencing and it is not considered that members are present at the meeting. The provision for archiving records has been updated to allow alternatives to paper records to be used.

#### **General Business**

Norm Moore spoke about how on some new vans they have plastic inner guards so please check yours out as it can be very dangerous.

Ian Palmer advised that the police in Melbourne are targeting caravanners and the weights that they are carrying. If they find you are overweight they will make you off load until you are the correct weight and then you are responsible for removing the items you have unloaded.

Ian Palmer told the meeting that an excellent time was had at Lakeside with paddle boarding and canoeing and was very organised by Coral Kane.

Ian Palmer spoke about how the club had been offered two defibrillators from the Elderslee Foundation (charitable organisation). Ian explained the need for some members to be trained in CPR and also on how to use the machine. The defibrillators will tell you what to do and if for any reason you are not pushing hard enough for CPR it will tell you to push harder and it also counts the number of compressions you have to do. He asked for a show of hands and approximately 26 people volunteered to learn. All members who attended were happy for the club to go ahead with obtaining the defibrillators and having people trained and to cover the ongoing costs ie. batteries and pads. Whilst they were at Lakeside an ambulance went through and lan asked if they could give a talk and demonstration on the defibrillators which was very interesting. A question was asked about the liabilities to doing this but lan advised that there was none.
