Extracts from State Association Minutes:

Public Liability Insurance: The insurance cover costs have been reviewed and van costs will now be \$7 per van. Each club must pay the liability insurance by 30th April each year. The basis of the insurance contribution will be the number of van members in each club as at 30 April at the rate of \$7.00 per van. This represents an 87% increase in the contribution rate.

Casino Village Resort: The Resort has agreed to a 15% discount (maximum \$50 per visit) for members of the State Association on production of a current State Membership Card. The discount is available for individuals as well as clubs.

State Association Membership Cards In the light of the agreement with the Casino Village Resort, the cards should continue to be issued. **2013 State Rally at Kempsey Showground.** Port Macquarie Regional Club will be the host club..

2014 STATE RALLY This is proposed to be held at the Mingara Club on the Central Coast.

Weight Tax: The State received a response from the Minister for Roads and Transport in respect of our submission on the weight tax. He has asked the RTA to provide a report on bases of charging registration and taxes on caravans and trailers and that our submission will be taken into account.

Oberon Rally October 2012: Ten member vans attended the rally at Jenolan Caravan Park at Oberon and the weather was just perfect until Sunday, which turned cooler with a few sprinkles. Morning tea and happy hour saw us all get together and chat the hours away. The Break-way Braking System, monitoring the battery. This has come about because the new van we are looking at has a GTM of over two-tonne. Researching this subject is a real challenge with no specifications on how this is to be done to meet the full requirements of the law. This law has been in force since the Vehicle Standards Information N0.22 was Issued in April 1998. The RTA Vehicle Inspectors Bulletin No.06 April 1998 to how they carry out the inspections. This means if you get caught using the excuse vou didn't know won't work. All I can say is if you get caught with a tow vehicle registered in NSW towing any form of trailer over two-tonne, fitted with a break-away breaking system and there is no battery monitoring device where the driver can see in the tow vehicle, the tow vehicle will be issued with a defect. The trailer will have to be left where the defect was issued. My first reference to this was in issue No.178 of the Caravan & Motorhome On Tour Magazine page 203. The author welcomed any comments about this story. After more "googling" I found a site that seemed to have a solution to the problem. I emailed the author with what I had found and got the following reply.

Hi Max. I had a look at the site you mentioned before I wrote the article and, while I agree that they have a good solution, I remain concerned that there is no official standard for how the charging/monitoring should be done. In the meantime I'm planning to write an article on how to wire up a NSW compliant charging/monitoring system in the near future and I'm thinking of using the RV Electronics product as a guide.

This makes additional parts needed for a breakaway monitoring system:

RM6000 remote battery monitor fitted in tow vehicle.

- 1.
- 2. 12 pin plug connection tow vehicle to caravan.
- 3. Breaksafe 6000 breakaway kit fitted to the caravan.

You have to look at the descriptions of both the RM6000 and the Breaksafe 6000 to understand how they meet the NSW regulations. If you currently have an unmonitored breakaway system you will have to upgrade the whole system, on your van and car to be compliant. Max Maughan
