New Road Rule in Victoria

There has been a recent law change in Victoria regarding blood alcohol concentration (BAC). *All drivers driving any vehicle with GVM over 4.5 tonnes must always have a zero-blood alcohol concentration (BAC).* This includes combined vehicle mass such as Caravans and 4WD tow vehicles. The BAC, rules for each state, differ greatly.

Green reflectors

These reflectors on side of road indicate that a truck stop is close by. Three reflectors are displayed first, then two followed by only one green reflector just before the truck stop. These stops are primarily for trucks and may have rough gravel on the road, however caravans may like to use them for a very short stop to allow traffic to pass.





Police do the Old Tele Track



Senior Constable Aleda Day on Sep 8, 2021 @ 4:00pm

Recently officers from Weipa Station, Cairns Tactical Crime Squad and Cairns and Cooktown Road Policing Units embarked on a three day traffic operation along the infamous Tele Track.

The Old Telegraph Track is one of the most iconic 4WD tracks or roads in

Queensland and is 350km of generally narrow track with some very rocky and eroded sections and some of the most spectacular creek crossings in the Cape.

The road is what is left of the original telegraph line that was used in the 1880s to connect Cairns with Thursday Island and for much of the Cape's history was the only available route to the tip.

There were some surprised 4WD enthusiasts when they discovered that police's promise to be 'Anywhere, Anytime' also meant on a dirt track in the middle of Cape York Peninsula with the closest police station some 250km away.

Safety first at creek crossings
The operation was targeting drink and drug
drivers, illegal vehicle modifications,
unregistered and uninsured vehicles as
well as antisocial behaviour involving
buggies, ATVs and motorbikes.



Thankfully most drivers were very well behaved, and with approximately 100

roadside breath tests conducted, police were pleasantly surprised they only located one intoxicated driver and issued a handful of Traffic Infringement Notices for failing to wear a seatbelt, exceeding the speed limit, defective vehicles and illegal modifications.



A 22-year-old Stratford man was intercepted for the purposes of a roadside breath test (RBT). He allegedly returned a reading of 0.07 per cent BAC and is expected to appear in the Weipa Magistrates Court on October 12 for drink driving.

A 51-year-old Umagico man was issued with two Traffic Infringement Notices after being intercepted on Telegraph Road at about 3pm on Wednesday, August 25, driving an unregistered and uninsured vehicle.



He received two tickets totalling \$992.





Whilst the Old Telegraph Track is only 350km long, the officers clocked up approximately 800km by the time they returned to Weipa Station, surprisingly the whole time they were on patrol they never left the Weipa division.

The Weipa division is part of the Cape Patrol Group which comprise some of the most remote and challenging environments in Queensland.

The Cape Patrol Group consists of the Aurukun, Coen, Kowanyama, Lockhart River, Pormpuraaw, Weipa Police Divisions and covers 99,491 square kilometres, which is some of the most isolated areas in Queensland.
