EASTER 10 days Friday 27th March to 6th April (Easter 2nd to 6th April) we arrive early to get a good powered site. Powered site for 10 days at the EPIC Centre (show ground) where the festival is held so you are on site.

We don't have any trouble filling the time before the festival starts as there is so much to see in Canberra and lots of it is free.

## The Amazing Kimberley's:

"Like no other place on earth"

After doing the big lap in 1986 we always wanted to go back and explore the Kimberley's that we missed. The Gibb River Road plus Purnululu National Park (Bungle Bungle's) and a trip out to the Horizontal Falls were on our bucket list. We stored our motorhome in Derby for 24 days unhooked the Suzuki, packed our camping gear and off we went in company with Phil's sister and brother in law. To say it met all our expectations is an understatement.

Just to mention some of the highlights.....We visited Mornington

Wilderness Camp (322,000 hectares) owned by the Australian Wildlife Conservancy which aims to deliver effective conservation for all Australian animal species. They own 23 sanctuaries around Australia and do wonderful work. We enjoyed three days of magic scenery and bird watching here.

Next was Mitchell Plateau which has the beautiful Mitchell Falls where we hiked the challenging 3 hr track from the campground to the most beautiful series of waterfalls. I opted for the 6 min helicopter ride back to camp, an exhilarating flight and view of the whole area.

We travelled on to Kalumburu up on the Kimberley coast on a not so good road, an aboriginal settlement population 400 and the interesting Kalumburu Mission. This has been there almost 100 yrs and now offers a campground with cabin good accommodation plus the town church, art gallery and interesting museum. Not so many tourists come up here as its 263km from the GR Rd. We also camped at a beach campground nearby on the coast, experiencing a beautiful sunset into the Timor Sea. Many keen fishermen come up here every year for several months as the fish are abundant, we were lucky enough to be given a bag of Red Emperor fillets by a friendly fisherman.

Among many beautiful camp spots a stand out was Home Valley Station on the Pentecost River, overlooking the magnificent Cockburn Ranges, what a view. While there a grey nomad lady went on a 4wd fishing tour and came back with the only Barramundi caught that day and a record for the Station at 1.25 mts, dually photographed and let go as protected that size.

I think everyone has heard of El Questro Station, it is a beautiful place and can be visited by vans and motorhomes as it's a sealed road from Kununurra end with only about 14 km of well-maintained dirt road to the established camp ground, there is a couple of river crossings about 300mm deep and while we were there we saw a huge tourist bus go through and normal vans and motorhomes. We enjoyed the Zebedee hot springs after a short rainforest walk, hired a tinny with elect outboard and spent 3 hrs totally on our own travelling up a beautiful gorge, had one of the private 26 creek front campsites for 4 nights where we could swim in the crystal clear croc free creek. We also enjoyed a beautiful Barra meal at the restaurant overlooking the river as a special treat. There is a big campground at the station with powered sites and excellent amenities.

After a short visit to Wyndham to restock with food we travelled down the highway to the Bungle Bungles. Wow, what can I say, one of the most amazing places we have seen. We camped 3 nights in one of the 2 National Park campgrounds, spent almost one day walking the northern end then the next day the southern end. One very disturbing thing happening in the Kimberley's is the arrival 3 years ago of the cane toads, a sign at our campground advised 40,000 cane toads had been collected in the campground over 2 weeks in April/May. We saw them while walking to the Cathedral Gorge by the dozen trapped in deep rock holes. Rangers collected 200 next day from these holes. Unfortunately there is no solution.

We sadly parted from our companions after the Bungles and travelled back to our million dollar penthouse (m/home)... well that's what it felt like after 24 days in the tent. It was a wonderful trip, it wasn't easy

by any means especially at our age, we were always covered in dust, some of the walks were very challenging, putting a tent up and down for this amount of time is not what I call fun although we were getting pretty good at it, we crossed about 50 or more rivers and creeks with water, travelled on some awful by roads, (the GR Rd is quite good) paid up to \$2.75 pl for fuel, did it all in our 2010 Suzuki Grand Vitara, (toy 4wd) didn't have a puncture but did have a shock absorber fail, apart from that she came through unscathed...But all that said we had the time of our lives.

The final part of our Kimberley adventure was two days later 27/6 on our 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary when we did the Horizontal Falls overnight trip. It is a 30 min flight from Derby by seaplane out to Talbot Bay where they have a small floating hotel (large houseboats) right near the amazing phenomenon of the 11 meter tides squeezing through two narrow gaps in the cliffs. We were transferred to a powerful 900hp fast boat to traverse the falls. I did my best to take some photos while hanging on for my life during the most thrilling ride through the churning water trying to fit though this narrow gap. We did lots of trips through the wider fall although the second narrower falls were too dangerous at the time the water being 2.5 mtrs higher on one side. We then quietly cruised along the coast to cyclone bay where they moor the houseboats during the wet season, a very beautiful coastline. During sunset a yummy barra dinner was served on the top deck and conversation flowed for the rest of the evening with the group of 16 guests and the 6 staff. The staff, a wonderful group of young people who know and enjoy their job here in the wilderness for 7 months every year enthralled us with stories of their experiences while living and working out there in Talbot Bay.

After a peaceful sleep in our cabin we were up at sunrise with breakfast served and another fast boat ride through the falls before the flight back to Derby over the most amazing coastline. 


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
