### Look What you have done

I sat down the other day and did a quick calculation of what you the members of TLC have donated to John Hunter Children's Hospital, and I think it is about \$1200.00. Below is a list of the things that have been bought with that money.

Things that can be reused......AFTER cleaning. Baby rattles, course and effect toys, Lego, cot mobiles, stacking toys, texters, NUNO (cards which are laminated,) games like connect 4, these things that are handed out to children then returned and cleaned. Not all toys get returned and things get broken there for they have to be replaced. This is what your donations go towards.

If you have or know of persons with a caravan, please take notice or pass on the stop use of Swift 500 cooktops and ovens

Immediate action is to isolate the gas at the isolation valve (usually a yellow handle) to the stove / cook top usually in the cupboard below or near the appliance Please see below notice

Background, two caravans have had serious gas explosions due to a manufacturing fault with in the cook top

# **SWIFT 500 SERIES INCIDENT**

Date: 08/06/2022

Due to circumstance beyond our control we have been informed by the ACCC that we need to notify our customer in regards to the Incident that has occurred. Please read the notice below and advise your customers that the Swift 500 series (All Models) are **NOT** ALLOWED TO BE USED AUSTRALIA WIDE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE. We hope this is a temporary situation, We are waiting on a reply from the ACCC and WA authorities as to what steps are to be taken next. Please be patient once we have more information we will advise through our website. Please be informed the electrical element can still be used.

Swift Appliance Group Pty Ltd is currently liaising with the ACCC, WA DMIRS and Resources Safety and Health Queensland regarding gas explosion safety risks in the 500—Series Caravan Gas Cookers. We will provide more information as soon as possible after conferring with the regulatory bodies. Consumers must immediately cease using the products until tests determine the cause of the explosion and the products are deemed safe.

#### **CEO** Weekly Message

Over the past 18 months, we have been campaigning with the NSW State Government to consider the unfairness in the current NSW toll system. Last month, the Government announced that there will be a formal review of the road toll system in the Sydney area; this review commenced this week. Many members have written to their local State Members of Parliament, and to me, which proved valuable in our communication with the Government.

On Wednesday, I was joined by Ken Newton (Chair of the Australian Caravan Club) and collectively under the umbrella of RV Clubs of Australia (RVCAL) we met with both sides of Government to discuss the key issues around this toll system. We presented the issues followed by a solution to both sides of Government, which we believe could be a fairer system for all RV consumers.

#### Issue 1 - Current Classification

Currently the fee structure is a debacle, with the Government and operator only allowing two categories. However, we are proposing a third category be added between the current two classes which will allow vehicles between 2.81m to 3.5m in height to be recognised for the Recreational Vehicle.

• Class A Vehicles 2.8 metres or less in height and 12.5 metres or less in length.

• Class B Recreational Vehicles between 2.81 metres to 3.5 metres in height or between 12.51 metres 16 metres in length.

Class C All other vehicles

#### Issue 2 – Vehicle Recognition

Currently, Transurban operate with a scanning program that detects height and length of vehicles. We are also seeking a simple change to have vehicle recognition through the number plate system that refers to registration and identification of that specific vehicle. Having RVs recognised through their registrations is a simple and easy resolution.

We will continue to work on these above issues, as they are major election elements in the lead up to the NSW election scheduled for March 2023. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our many CMCA members who have written to their local Members of Parliament voicing their concerns. I encourage you to continue doing this and forward a copy for myself to keep on hand.

### DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE STICKERS

### This was a question put to Sergeant Rees - the following is from Transport NSW

- 1. <u>NSW Centre for Road Safety</u> >
- 2. <u>Staying safe</u> >

# <u>Do not overtake turning vehicle signs</u>

#### Listen



# Overall length of 7.5m or greater

A caravan and towing vehicle with a combined overall length of 7.5m or greater is required to have a 'DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE' sign attached to its rear, if the vehicle and caravan combination intend to momentarily occupy an adjacent lane ('straddle') when making a turn.

Straddling lanes to turn allows the driver additional space to turn safely, especially on tight bends.

'DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE' signs also require other vehicles to give way.

Please note: Straddling adjacent lanes while turning without the warning sign displayed is illegal in NSW.

The requirement to have a 'DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE' warning sign attached is common across most states and territories to allow the straddling of lanes, and is part of the model law <u>Australian Road Rules (PDF,</u> 6.3MB) .

The requirements for NSW can be found in the NSW Road Rules 2014.

# DO NOT OVERTAKE Preferred sign

**TURNING VEHICLE** The preferred sign should have a minimum area of 0.125 square metres, and the words "DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE" should appear on the sign in block letters, with a height of not less than 50 millimetres. This sign is the most visible to other drivers, providing them sufficient warning to provide caravans and towing vehicles room to manoeuvre while turning. **Other acceptable signs** Alternate acceptable "DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE" signs include one measuring 300mm by 100mm, and another measuring 300mm by 300mm.More information on using and fitting Rear Marking Plates can be found on





Black Top Opal Run Map




