Bob Ketley said his tyre servicing agent had advised him that a tyre that is out of balance also places pressure on the wheel bearings. The agent said that a small amount of weight out of balance at rest can increase to the equivalent of 1lb of weight at 100Kph. Check it out for yourself

REMINDER SAFETY-CHECK BOX

Have your <u>caravan wheels balanced</u>. It costs about \$6 per wheel. It will reduce van vibration and strain on your wheel bearings.

26/05/09. We went for a drive & visited Olio Bello, which is an olive oil farm. We bought a selection of oils then we visited a fudge shop & we had to buy some.

27/05/09. We are heading towards Augusta, which is the southern point of WA; we drove to the Leeuwin Lighthouse & had a look around. We then headed towards Pemberton which is famous for the giant Kauri Trees which grows straight up to 60 meters high. We were doing the tourist drive & our first stop was the Gloucester Tree where Key & I climbed up about half way, what a challenge we surprised ourselves. Then we drove to the Cascades where the water was running very fast after all the rain it was quite a sight. Then headed the Bicentennial tree which was enormous you could also climb it, then visited Beedelup Falls & Big Brook Dam it was a lovely drive through the National Parks.

There is a long jetty out the front of the caravan park & they have a resident seal that lives there & when we walked out to the jetty he was lying on the sand under the jetty & he sat up & posed for us he his enormous & quite a poser & the locals call him Sammy.

<u>05/06/09</u>. On the road early ready for a long drive to Wave Rock. We walked all over it & under it, it was fascinating we took lots of photos.

06/06/09 .We headed to York it has a lot of history and is a quaint country town. We arrived at New Norica, and booked a tour. The tour was so interesting it was about 2 Spanish Monks that came over in 1846 to educate the Aborigines and told us how it had been used as a school to teach not iust the Aborigines but the well to do people in Perth and today it still brings people there to stay. There are 6 Monks still living there making it a viable business with the help of the Benedictine Community as it is the only monastic town in Australia. We were so pleased we had gone on the tour as it was something we wouldn't forget as it had the most beautiful art work & wood work all done by the Monks & local Artist over the centuries & still being preserved for the future.

<u>07/06/09</u>. Next day we drove to Cervantes to see the Pinnacles. They are lime stone pillars in the Desert & they are all shapes and sizes, they rose from the sand dunes and are a wonderful site to see. <u>08/06/09</u>. Today we are heading to
